We want to partner with you to lead your student through their faith journey. We know it can be challenging, and you might not know where to start. Don't worry! Here are some questions about tonight's message that you can ask your student after groups to kick-start the conversation.

REPORT

- What stood out to you from tonight's message?
- What was the main idea of the sermon?
- What did you discuss regarding God's character?

REFLECT

- Was there anything you struggled with or didn't understand?
- Was there a passage of scripture or point that resonated with you?
- Why did Jesus have to die for the scripture you discussed tonight? Or How does this point us to the Gospel?

REPORT

- Is there anything that you feel God is calling you to do?
- In what ways do you feel convicted by this scripture?
- How does this text make you more like Jesus? How does it help you follow Jesus better?

SHARE – Parents, your voice matters. Sharing your own struggles, beliefs, and personal experience will deepen your relationship with your student. Be vulnerable and share how you have seen God work in your life, in both the good and the bad. Point them to the hope that you have found in Jesus.
